



You will have seen reports of Storm Isha and Jocelyn causing disruption to many parts of the Country, largely because of winds gusting up to 70/80mph. A yellow weather warning for strong wind remains in place across our area, with further bad weather forecast tomorrow and into Wednesday in the form of Storm Jocelyn.

Disruption here in Rutland has been minimal, so far. Three trees were reported down overnight on roads near Normanton, Thistleton and Cottesmore. All were quickly cleared by our Highways Service and there has no further disruption reported across other service areas.
